Subject: NCI Bid Board Posting - Upgrade to the MINFLUX nano-resolution microscope

The research program in the Laboratory of Receptor Biology and Gene Expression concerns the elucidation of mechanisms involved in the regulation of genetic expression in eukaryotic cells, the architecture and organization of the mammalian nucleus, and the identification of genes and regulatory processes involved in modulated states of expression during oncogenesis. The lab includes six internationally recognized research groups, headed by senior investigators Tom Misteli, Yamini Dalal, Shalini Oberdoerffer, Daniel Larson, and Gordon Hager, and tenure track investigator Efsun Arda.

The MINLFUX microscope in the Optical Microscopy Core (OMC) in Bldg 41 is a system that allows imaging single molecules with a resolution down to 2 nm. The system builds up an image of a region one molecule at a time, and it is therefore imperative that the sample does not move during imaging. To accomplish this, samples have gold beads added as fiducial markers that the MINFLUX system constantly monitors and automatically adjusts the microscope stage to compensate for any drift. Because these beads are attached to the glass surface and imaging occurs inside the cytoplasm or nucleus of cells, the beads are typically out of focus, which degrades the performance of the stabilization. The requested upgrade will allow the focus of the beads to be adjusted, greatly improving the performance of the stabilization system and thereby allowing OMC users to maximize the resolution of the system.

The National Cancer Institute plans to purchase the upgrade to the MINFLUX nano-resolution microscope from Abberior Instruments America, LLC, in Bethesda, MD. This is not a request for a competitive quotation. However, if any interested party believes it can meet the attached requirements, it may submit a statement of capabilities. The capability statement must be in writing and must contain information and material in sufficient detail to allow NCI to determine if the party can fully meet this requirement. The capability statement must be received in the contracting office by 11:30 AM on June 25, 2024, ET. A determination by the Government not to compete with this requirement based upon responses to this notice is solely within its discretion. Information received will be considered exclusively to determine whether to conduct a competitive procurement.

#### Sole Source Justification:

The MINFLUX nano-resolution microscope is a unique and powerful system developed solely by Abberior Instruments, LLC. Upgrades to the system must be completed by an engineer trained to service this specific instrument. Abberior Instruments is the only company that offers upgrade service that would not void the warranty and service contract.

#### 1.0 TITLE

Purchase of an Upgrade to the MINFLUX stabilization system

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND

The MINLFUX microscope in the Optical Microscopy Core (OMC) in Bldg 41 is a system that allows imaging single molecules with a resolution down to 2 nm. The system builds up an image of a region one molecule at a time, and it is therefore imperative that the sample does not move during imaging. To accomplish this, samples have gold beads added as fiducial markers that the MINFLUX system constantly monitors and automatically adjusts the microscope stage to compensate for any drift. Because these beads are attached to the glass surface and imaging occurs inside the cytoplasm or nucleus of cells, the beads are typically out of focus, which degrades the performance of the stabilization. The requested upgrade will allow the focus of the beads to be adjusted, greatly improving the performance of the stabilization system and thereby allowing OMC users to maximize the resolution of the system.

- Allows the MINFLUX stabilization system to be adjusted to account for the different focal planes between the area of interest to be imaged and the gold beads used by the system to compensate for stage drift.
- Compatibility with the Abberior Instruments MINFLUX microscope
- Compatibility with Abberior Instruments Imspector microscope control software

Delivery will occur within 120 days ARO.

- (d) *Inspection/Acceptance*. The Contractor shall tender for acceptance only those items that conform to the requirements of this contract. The Government reserves the right to inspect or test any supplies or services that have been tendered for acceptance. The Government may require repair or replacement of nonconforming supplies or reperformance of nonconforming services at no increase in contract price. The Government must exercise its post acceptance rights-

- (e) Excusable delays. notice of termination, plus reasonable charges that the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government, using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred that reasonably could have been avoided.
